though the origin of this name is derogatory, meaning people of the "dirty water") peoples whose relationship to this land continues today. I invite you to take a moment for reflection upon the many leg-acies of violence, displacement, migration, and settlement that have shaped our presence here today and to adopt an attitude of reverence and gratitude for the ongoing resilience of this place and the people who have called it home.
